

Sixth Form Dress Code

One of the privileges of being a Sixth Former is no longer having to wear a uniform. However, students at the Redhill Academy Sixth Form should dress in a manner which is appropriate for a school environment.

General rule: school appropriate dress will always cover areas shaded on the sketch in Figure 1.

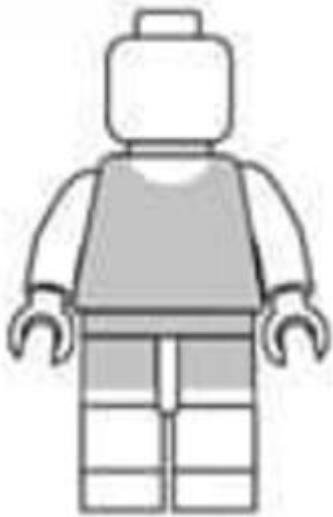

In addition, there are some specific restrictions...

1. Students must wear their **lanyards** at all times whilst on the premises
2. No **shorts** of any kind
3. No strappy vests/dresses OR cropped tops that reveal **underwear or midriffs**
4. No **baseball caps**
5. No **outdoor clothes** are to be worn when in a lesson, including coats, hats and scarves

The majority of students demonstrate the ability to make sensible dress choices for sixth form. However, if concerns are raised, as an academy we reserve the right to decide what constitutes reasonable limits in this matter. You may be asked to return home to change if it is deemed necessary.

10 Key Expectations

High standards help to ensure the smooth running of our Sixth Form and lead to high levels of achievement.

1. 95% attendance at least. Absences should be notified by parent/carer before 8.30am
2. Punctuality. Students are expected to be on time for all lessons.
3. All homework should be completed on time to a strong standard and presented well.
4. Students must adhere to the dress code. No hats, coats or scarfs to be worn indoors. LANYARDS to be worn at ALL TIMES.
5. No mobile phones to be used outside of the Sixth Form Centre.
6. Respect the Study Zones and classrooms at all times.
7. No smoking or vaping on or anywhere near the school site.
8. No part-time work, medical appointments or driving lessons to take place during the school day.
9. No holidays to be taken during term time
10. To always act as a role model and positive representative of Redhill in and out of school upholding the Redhill Way.



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
