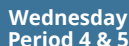

For students eager to combine their passion for sport with a qualification that enhances future applications while developing leadership and employability skills, the Level 2 Certificate in Community Sports Leadership offers an ideal opportunity. This nationally recognised qualification equips learners with the confidence and competence to lead groups in sport and physical activity sessions within a community setting, under indirect supervision.

The course focuses on building practical leadership skills through hands-on experience—planning, delivering, and evaluating sessions, as well as organising events.



Designed for students who want to maintain and apply their mathematical skills without taking A-Level Maths, Core Maths is recognised by UCAS and universities nationwide. It enhances your university application and can even lead to reduced offers for certain courses. More importantly, it demonstrates your confidence with numbers—a highly valued skill in virtually every career path.

Highly recommended for potential Oxbridge applicants, this enrichment activity is designed to prepare students for competitive interviews. It also benefits all learners by developing advocacy, confidence, and communication skills.

Speaking in Public helps students tackle one of the most common challenges—public speaking. Learners write and deliver their own speeches, researching topics, creating visual aids, and presenting their ideas with clarity and conviction. As they progress, students build the ability to speak confidently, project their voice effectively, and engage an audience. They learn how to structure their speeches for impact and use persuasive techniques to hold attention.

The Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) is an excellent opportunity for students applying to competitive university courses to demonstrate a genuine interest in a subject beyond their A Level studies—such as criminology, medicine, or any area not covered by their current curriculum.

The AQA EPQ is a Level 3 qualification, equivalent to half an A Level, designed to stretch and challenge students beyond the standard syllabus. It allows learners to independently research and produce a project on a topic of their choice—often something they're passionate about or considering for future study. Recognised by UCAS and universities, the EPQ can significantly strengthen a university application. In many cases, a strong EPQ submission can lead to reduced offers from a range of institutions, making it a valuable asset for ambitious students.

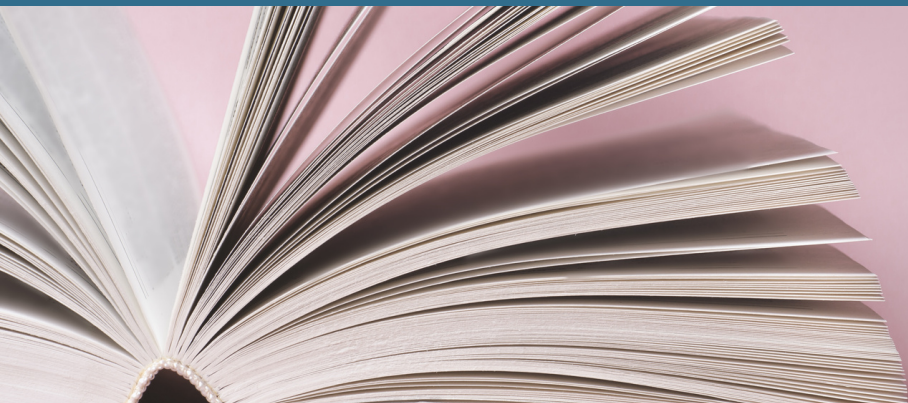

The Duke of Edinburgh's Award (DofE) is a prestigious and highly respected programme that challenges young people to develop independence, resilience, and a sense of adventure.

Participants engage in a diverse set of activities across four key sections: Volunteering, Physical, Skills, and Expedition. At Gold level, an additional Residential section is required, offering a unique opportunity to live and work with new people in an unfamiliar environment.

Recognised by universities and employers alike, the DofE Award is a powerful addition to any CV or personal statement, showcasing commitment, initiative, and a willingness to go beyond the classroom.

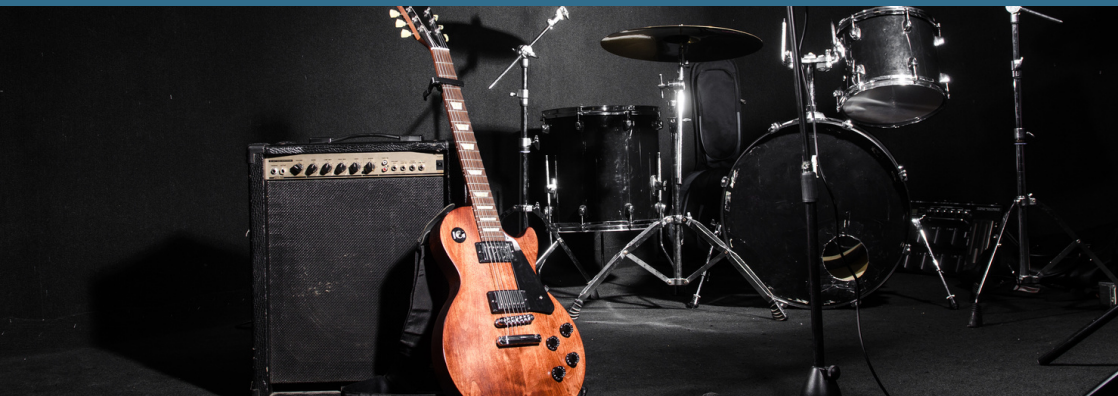
